#### DCC Awarded \$150,000 in State Funds for Students in Need

Dutchess Community College has received a grant of \$150,000 to assist students struggling with housing and food insecurity. The funding, secured by New York State Assemblymember Didi Barrett and the Dutchess Community College Foundation, and administered by DCC CARES, will help alleviate homelessness and hunger for young, low-income DCC students.

"We are so appreciative of the support Assemblymember Barrett is providing to these students with limited resources yet unlimited potential," said DCC President Peter Grant Jordan. ## Middle States Update

After two years of preparation for the Self-Study process, DCC took a major step toward reaffirmation of its accreditation by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE) at the end of October. Dr. Quintin Bullock, president of the Community College of Allegheny County, visited campus and provided feedback on the draft report of DCC's performance on the MSCHE



Standards and Requirements of Affiliation. Dr. Bullock met with the leadership of the College as well as those key to construction of the Self-Study document.

Reflecting on the experience, the three Self-Study co-chairs were positive about the path ahead. "We are so fortunate that Dr. Bullock was selected as the chair of our Visiting Evaluation Team," stated Dr. Susan Rogers, chief of staff & vice president for Institutional Effectiveness. "Dr. Bullock's experience as a community college leader both in and outside of SUNY is both inspiring and reassuring."

Scott Schnackenberg, acting vice president for Enrollment & Student Success, said, "Dr. Bullock's comments and suggestions were extremely useful and we will be able to use them as a guide as we finish up the Self-Study."

"It was exciting to share with Dr. Bullock the breadth and depth of participation on campus," commented Professor Michael Hall, Behavioral Science department chair. "I believe he left with an appreciation of the work already accomplished and was confident the campus was aware of the work necessary to have a successful visit by the full MSCHE Team in April 2023."

#### Shared Governance Wellness Check

Dr. Jordan, FCCC Delegate Margeaux Lippman and PSO leadership are exploring the possibility of bringing the Faculty Council of Community Colleges (FCCC) Wellness Check to campus. "The FCCC Wellness Check is a service offered by FCCC as a collaborative process between administration and the governance body to assess the strengths, weaknesses, pain points and blind spots in a campus' governance system. It's literally like a checkup," said Margeaux Lippman.



### Community Engagement

Dr. Jordan was the keynote speaker at three presentations in the Hudson Valley area in October. At a Fishkill Town Board meeting, Dr. Jordan, Susan Rogers and Dan Barbuto introduced DCC's plans to expand DCC @ Fishkill's offerings to include a new Mechatronics lab next fall. Also Dr. Jordan spoke to the Rhinebeck Chamber of Commerce and Thriving in Rhinebeck, where he detailed DCC's mission to provide "Cradle to Cane" educational opportunities to the communities of the Hudson Valley. "It is important that we continually engage our surrounding communities so that they are aware of the educational and life-enriching opportunities that DCC can provide all residents," explained Dr. Jordan.
