College and Community Action Partnership Team Up to Purchase Textbooks for Students

Twenty students had their textbook costs covered thanks to a collaboration between DCC and the Community Action Partnership of Dutchess County. Following a campus visit to meet with select students, representatives of the Partnership received approval from the New York State Department of State to disperse over \$12,000 in funds for fall textbook purchases.

Faculty Member Seeks Participation in Agricultural and Food Advisory Working Group

Jordan Dawdy, a new faculty member in BHS who teaches Sociology, is interested in forming an agricultural and food advisory working group with the goal of increasing food security on campus and perhaps incorporating agriculture into the curricula. The group could serve to explore and spearhead efforts such as a campus food pantry, farm, and the development of new courses relevant to agriculture and food. Jordan suggests that programs across campus might be able to utilize this new learning environment, including biology, health, sociology, early childhood education, architecture, business, communication, visual arts, engineering, and our daycare.

Jordan's doctorate in Rural Sociology from the University of Missouri, experience on a research team that focused on food security and personal examination of alternative food movements, are fueling this interest in bringing these initiatives to DCC.
