ACADEMIC AFFILIATION AGREEMENT

Effective as of October 1, 2019

ACPHS and DCC desire to cooperate in accordance with the terms of this agreement to provide a mechanism by which students completing all necessary prerequisites through the Associate in Science at DCC can be accepted into the first professional year of the Doctor of Pharmacy program at ACPHS.

- 1. This Agreement sets forth the terms and conditions under which students completing the Associate in Science Degree (AS) at DCC can apply to fill available seats, as determined by ACPHS. The Doctor of Pharmacy program at ACPHS will provide at least 5 seats per year for students from DCC.
- 2. DCC will provide a structured curriculum in a listed AS degree program. ACPHS will likewise provide a structured curriculum in the Doctor of Pharmacy program.

As such, DCC will:

- A. Orient DCC students and faculty to pertinent rules and policies associated with this agreement
- B. Appoint an advisor who will maintain contact with DCC students and the ACPHS Office of Admissions specifically to share information on student progress and status of the agreement
- C. Provide students with information regarding the PharmCAS application and program materials, or make arrangements for this to occur

And as such, ACPHS will:

- A. Make final determinations on the acceptance of students in the Doctor of Pharmacy program
- B. Provide the program advisor at DCC with information regarding student acceptance into the Doctor of Pharmacy program
- C. Provide documentation to DCC regarding the performance of DCC students in the Doctor of Pharmacy program

In order to predict the correct number of student registrations, faculty advisors for DCC and ACPHS will annually project the number of students and course enrollments.

- 3. Decisions on PharmCAS applications to the Doctor of Pharmacy program at ACPHS will be made in accordance with the standards described below. These standards may be modified from time to time by ACPHS.
 - A. Completion of the required pre-pharmacy courses at DCC as specified in the course equivalency appendix by the end of the summer semester prior to fall matriculation.
 - B. Applications must be submitted online through the Pharmacy College Application Service (PharmCAS). The deadline for early decision application is September 1 in the year prior to desired fall matriculation. All other applications must be submitted before March 1 in the spring prior to fall matriculation. Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis.
 - C. Candidates must take and submit a PCAT entrance exam score through PharmCAS. The minimum PCAT composite score accepted is at or above the 30th percentile, including a PCAT writing score of 3 or better.
 - D. The overall GPA must be 3.3 or greater and the math/science GPA must be 3.2 or greater.
 - E. Qualified candidates will be invited to campus and must successfully complete an interview at ACPHS.
 - F. All transferred courses must have been completed with a C or better. Courses completed with grades less than C may be used to satisfy DCC requirements as described in the DCC catalog, but will not be granted credit at ACPHS.
 - G. The following course transfer policies will apply:
 - The granting of credit for courses taken in High School (i.e. AP courses) or before High School graduation may be re-evaluated using existing established ACPHS guidelines.
 - Courses used for elective credit are subject to guidelines used in the evaluation of traditional ACPHS transfers. For example, Physical Education/Activity course credits are not transferable.
 - Courses transferred into DCC are subject to re-approval for equivalence by ACPHS.
 - H. Selection of students to the program who meet these criteria in excess of annual minimum set by ACPHS shall be made in accordance with ACPHS admissions policies. Students not eligible for this program are welcome to apply to the pre-pharmacy program with decisions made in accordance with ACPHS admissions policies. The course transfer equivalency outlined in the course equivalency table will apply to students from DCC under this agreement.
 - I. Students in the program will be required to have computers that are compatible with systems and software used at ACPHS.
 - J. The admission requirements in this agreement reflect general requirements for entrance into the first professional year of the Doctor of Pharmacy program at the Albany, NY campus. Students interested in the program at the Colchester, VT campus should consult with ACPHS directly for additional guidance.

- 4. This Agreement is effective as of the Effective Date set forth above. This program will be reviewed on an ongoing basis in order to modify the requirements as necessary. The program may be altered with the prior written consent of both institutions. Should either DCC or ACPHS wish to terminate the program, one year advance written notice will be given; students already enrolled will be permitted to complete their programs of study.
- 5. Both DCC and ACPHS may publicize the program in the appropriate publications and bulletins, subject to pre-approval by both institutions.
