Professional Staff

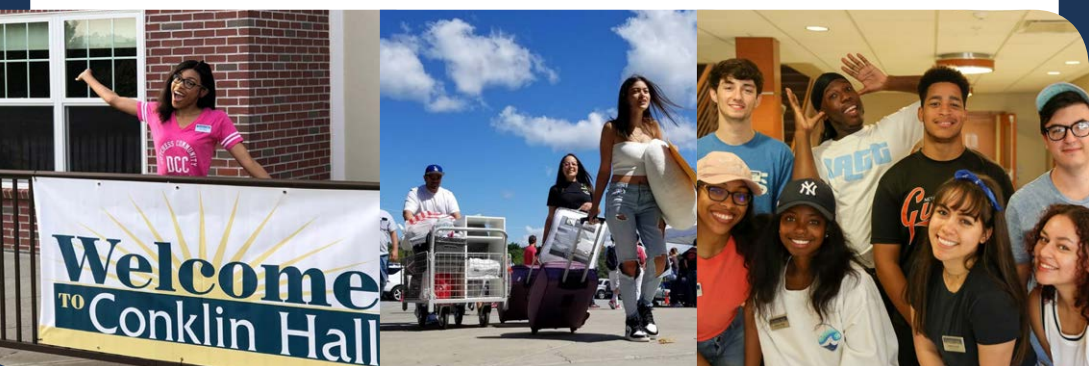
The professional staff consists of an Administrative Housing Assistant, the Director of Residence Life and two Residence Hall Coordinators. The professional team is equipped to deal with crisis management and intervention.

Resident Assistants (RAs)

RAs are trained student leaders that rotate on-call shifts to enforce policies and connect with the professional staff on-call for emergency response. RAs will either be at the front desk or in their office in the lobby during their evening shifts. RAs are responsible for creating engaging programs, mentoring, and policy enforcement. RAs are essential to mentor other students into leadership positions and help further their development within the hall.

Community Assistants (CAs)

CAs can be found at the front desk lobby throughout the day assisting guests as well as students navigating their way through campus. CAs are responsible for sorting student mail, assisting with room lock outs, rental items, as well as engaging programs.

How to Apply

Housing applications from students who will be enrolled full time in an associate degree or certificate program at DCC will be accepted beginning in February for the following fall semester. Students who wish to live in the residence hall should apply early — and complete financial aid paperwork immediately — as space is limited. Housing Eligibility

Students who have a high school grade point average of at least a 75 (or a minimum TASC score of 2800) are eligible to live in the residence hall. Students who do not meet this requirement may attend DCC but may not live on campus until successfully completing at least one full-time semester with a grade point average of 2.0.

Students transferring from another regionally accredited college must have a grade point average of at least 2.0 in order to be eligible for housing.
