

Psychology at SUNY Oswego

The SUNY Oswego Psychology Department focuses on the scientific study of human and nonhuman animal behavior. Students have the opportunity to gain a solid foundation in psychological theory and scientific methodology while conducting research with faculty who conduct state-of-the-art research in our on campus labs in various sub-disciplines in psychology including bio-physiological psychology, clinical psychology, cognitive psychology, developmental psychology and social psychology.

Our department contributes to a variety of other psychology-related programs for students, which include the psychology minor, the psychology-philosophy major, the human-computer interaction (HCI) degree program, the dual degree BA/MBA program in psychology and business, and the advanced trauma studies certificate program. The Psychology Department also has partnered with other departments to offer majors and minors in areas such as cognitive science, expressive arts therapy, and linguistics.

Psychology Department Labs

Developmental Studies Lab: Projects reflect an interest in learning about the development and mechanisms of attention as well as behaviors related to attention such as spontaneous eye blinking, learning to reach and working memory.

Learning and Emotion Lab: The Learning and Emotion Lab is focused on uncovering the relationships between students' learning and their emotional (affective) states.

Emotion Processing Across Development: We examine the social, emotional and physiological mechanisms associated with various life stages.

Primate Behavior and Cognition: Projects include development of tool use in wild capuchin monkeys in Brazil, vocal behavior of capuchin monkeys, and many more!

RAD Lab: The Relationships Across Development Laboratory examines how experiences in close personal relationships are internalized and contribute to social and emotional functioning across the lifespan.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

All students graduating from SUNY Oswego must have:

- ✓ A minimum GPA of 2.0 for graduation (in major & cumulative)
- ✓ A minimum of **120** hours for degree purposes
- ✓ 42 credits of upper division work (300-400 level) from Oswego
- ✓ Maximum transfer credits of **60** from community college
- ✓ At least ½ of major credits taken at Oswego
- ✓ Major and cognate courses completed with a C- or better

4. Make sure your remaining DCC courses meet Oswego Course Equivalents. (Consult the course equivalency table in this passport)
5. **Complete SUNY Gen Ed Requirements at DCC to be exempt from Gen Ed at Oswego! (See below for more information, or speak with an advisor)**
6. Apply to SUNY Oswego as you near the completion of your CC degree, and speak with a Transfer Advisor
7. **Complete your DCC degree**

- ✓ Courses taken at 2-year school will **not transfer as upper division credit at Oswego**. These courses will transfer as lower division credits.

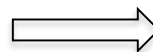
