

Nursing Eligibility Rubric

Admission to DCC's Nursing Program is based on a point system. To calculate the number of points you have earned, follow the instructions below. Please note all application materials must be submitted by March 1st to be considered. LPNs follow the same admissions guidelines and must provide their LPN license.

Required qualifications for all applicants:

- All applicants must be residents of Dutchess or Putnam Counties.
- All applicants must have attended a Nursing Information Session.
- All applicants must have a cumulative GPA of at least a 2.75. If you are a transfer student this may include your GPA from any previous colleges.
- All required prerequisites must be completed or in progress by **February 1st** and students must have a rubric score of at least 82 when applying to the nursing program (Use the rubric below).
- All applicants must have earned a C or better in all Nursing biology courses (BIO 131, 132), and they must be completed within five years of applying. BIO 132 can be in progress at the time of application.
- The TEAS exam must be completed with an overall score of at least 'Proficient' (scores are valid for 18 months).
- If seats remain available after the initial admission selection, students may submit an application by June 1st for program consideration. When a late application is submitted, pre-requisite courses taken in the spring and the spring GPA can be used for the point rubric.

Step 2: Biology Courses:

Use the chart listed below to determine the number of points earned based on your grades in the biology courses required for the Nursing Program. To be considered, Anatomy and Physiology I & II must be completed within five years of application date (BIO 132 can be in progress at time of application, however will not be considered in the point rubric. Also be sure to factor in possible point reductions, if applicable.)

(Point Reductions: If you repeated BIO 131 and or BIO 132 because you earned below a C then deduct 2 points for the first attempt, 4 more points for a second attempt, and 6 more points for a third attempt). See example

The maximum number of points that can be earned is 143, the minimum number of points you need to be eligible to apply is 82. The more points you have earned, the more likely you have of being admitted to the Nursing Program. There are 56 available seats. The average number of points earned by accepted students varies each fall semester based on the applicants for that particular admissions cycle. In the event of a tie, the TEAS scores will serve as a tie breaker.

To ensure a correct evaluation of your application, the following items must be in place:

- Official transcripts of any course work and/or degrees not completed at DCC and included in the point rubric
- Current license, certificate, or proof of LPN, EMT, CNA status
- Verification of veteran status
